Today's the Deadline for getting your entry emailed [or called in] for the "Best-Guess-for 1st Scab Infection Date for 2017 at the Sparta Location" ....Judge being Amy Irish-Brown-MSU.

Thinking ahead .... Check your SprayShed for 'Glacier' if you think you may need some again.

Please...Dont wait for the dreaded ForeCast and then decide to order it. Quite a few guys were 'left-out-in-the-Cold' in the last couple years by waiting til the last minute.

Glacier is intensely systemic and taken into the plant structure acting as an 'anti-freeze' ...and works as a 'Ice-Formation-Inhibitor' thereby reducing surface ice markings on Fruit.
