It is imperative to consider what has worked very very well in the past....

**Per Acre:**

**1 Lb. Strep**

**1 Pt. CS2005**

**If** you have Tested Positive to the **Resistant** Strains of Strep...???

\*\*You need to consider if there's enuf Bloom on a couple of those earliest Varieties to warrant Kasumin.....?? Or...

\*\*Do 1 Pint CS2005 plus 1 Lb.Mycoshield plus 1 Lb. Strep

The Resistant Strains are normally not the only strains out there in your Orchard that you're dealing with....and Strep is fairly LowCost.

The MycoShield will only help with the Bacteria's activity going forward.

The "005" will assist in stopping the Bacteria activity and work as a systemic long-lasting Protectant.... Proven very Successful.
